Touring Teams

The club remains on track to maintain a regular programme of sending touring teams to compete in the National Championships of our fellow nations, albeit a year later than planned with Andy "Turbo" Barnes' 2021 team now aiming to be in South Africa & Kenya in 2022 instead.

Changes to club management
