

English Twenty Club Rules

- The Club shall be called the 'English Twenty Club', also known as 'English XX Club'.
- 2. The objects of the Club are to foster target shooting in the interests of National Defence, and in particular to organise the English team in any International match shot in the disciplines covered by the Club (see Bye-law 1).

3. Membership

- (a) Membership is open only to those eligible to shoot for England under the rules for the time being in force for the National Challenge Trophy Match and who are subjects of The Sovereign.
- (b) A candidate for membership must be proposed and seconded by members of the Club and approved as specified in Bye-law 2.
- (c) Members shall be Life Members or Under 25 Members or Annual Members (see Bye-law 3).
- (d) New Members or Associates (as defined in Rule 6) shall not be admitted to membership or be entitled to any of the privileges of membership specified in Rule 5 unless not less than three days have elapsed from the date of their being proposed and seconded for membership under paragraph (b) of this Rule or elected under Rule 6(a).
- (e) Members, who subsequently become ineligible for membership under Rule 3(a) by adopting another nationality, may continue in membership and have the privileges given in Rule 5 (a), (b), (c) and (d).

4. Subscriptions

- (a) Subscriptions shall be paid to the Club as specified in Bye-law 3. Subscription rates are fixed by Council, provided the subscription is not increased by more than the increase in the retail price index since the subscription was last set. If Council needs to impose a greater increase the new subscription must be agreed at a general meeting (see Rule 14).
- (b) Annual Members must pay their subscriptions each year before they take part in any event, decision-making procedure or meeting for Club members. A member who is not active may pay the subscription at any time up to 31 August (the end of the financial year). A member who fails to pay the subscription shall be removed from the list of members. A lapsed member may apply to rejoin the Club by completing the current application forms.

5. Privileges of Membership

The privileges of membership are:

- (a) to attend, speak and vote at any general meeting of the Club
- (b) to have access to the yearbook
- (c) to wear the Club blazer badge and tie
- (d) to compete for the Jewels in the District or Division (see Rule 11) in which registered
- (e) to shoot in any event organised by the Club for its members
- (f) to receive the support of the Club in any efforts that may be made to encourage target shooting for English shooters

(g) to be considered for selection for the National, Mackinnon and Lawrence matches and for other England and English Twenty Club teams.

Annual Members shall not be entitled to any of the above privileges until they have paid their subscriptions for the current year.

6. Schools and Cadet Units

Schools and Cadet Units may affiliate to the English Twenty Club. The affiliation fee is fixed by Council and shall be paid as specified in Bye-law 3. The privileges of affiliation are described in Bye-law 6.

7. Associates

- (a) The Council shall have the power to elect as an Associate any person whose services to the Club or to target shooting in England have been of exceptional value.
- (b) Associates shall pay no subscription and shall have no vote at the Annual General Meeting. They shall have the privileges given in Rule 5 except (d), (e) and (g).

8. Council

- (a) The affairs of the Club shall be managed by and its assets vested in a Council consisting of a President, Past Presidents and Executive Vice-Presidents (see Rule 10) subject to (f) below, members as provided for in (b), (c) and (d) below, an Honorary Secretary and an Honorary Treasurer, who may be the same person.
- (b) Up to nine members shall be elected as stipulated in (e) and (g) below.
- (c) One member may be nominated by the UK Armed Forces and one member may be nominated by the Council for Cadet Rifle Shooting. Nominations for these posts must be with the Honorary Secretary by the end of September each year.
- (d) The Captains of the England National and Mackinnon teams shall be exofficio members of the Council for a period of one year from the announcement of their appointments.
 - The Representative of the District Superintendents Group (see Rule 11) shall be invited annually to be a voting member of the Council. Superintendents of Divisions (see Rule 11) with enough members to qualify for a bronze jewel as defined in Bye-law 7 shall be invited annually to be voting members of Council.
- (e) The President, Honorary Secretary, Honorary Treasurer and the nine members in (b) shall be elected for a period of three years. One third of the members in (b) above shall retire in rotation in each year, those willing being eligible for re-election at the AGM in accordance with (g) below. All persons covered by this rule must be paid up members of the Club.
- (f) If they intend to act in an executive capacity, the Past Presidents and Vice-Presidents shall declare this annually in writing to the Honorary Secretary within a period of 90 days after the Annual General Meeting. Executive Past Presidents or Executive Vice-Presidents shall be ex-officio members of Council. See also rule 10.
- (g) Any new candidate for election as President, Honorary Secretary or Honorary Treasurer, or for election to the Council may be proposed by the

Council or must be nominated in writing by two members of the Club. All candidates for a particular post must be proposed and seconded 35 days before the AGM. Where there are two or more nominations for any of the positions of President, Honorary Secretary or Honorary Treasurer, or where in the case of the nine elected members in Rule 8(b) above there are more nominations than elected places to be filled on the Council, there shall be a ballot of members to determine the outcome. The Council shall determine the method of ballot and other aspects of the administration of the voting procedure not specified in Rule 8(h).

(h) In the case of the President, Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer, members of the Club shall be accorded one vote for each contested position, and the person polling the highest number of votes for each of the contested positions shall be elected. In the case of the elected members of Council, members of the Club shall be accorded such number of votes as there are available positions, not more than one of which may be given to any one candidate. A member may use none, or any number of their votes as they consider appropriate. The candidates polling the highest number of votes shall be elected. Only paid up members of the Club voting in accordance with Rule 8(g) shall be entitled to vote.

In the event of a tie for the post of President the Chairman of Council shall have a casting vote. In the event of a tie for any other post the President shall have a casting vote.

- 9. Council Powers and Authorised Lease Signatories
 - (a) The Council shall have power to:
 - (i) Appoint a chairman of Council from amongst its members.
 - (ii) Make, amend or cancel such Bye-laws or Regulations (subject to the Rules of the Club and provided that they are not contrary to or inconsistent with any of these Rules) as they may consider expedient for the proper working of the Club. Such Bye-laws, and Regulations shall be binding on all members until set aside by the votes of twothirds of the members present a General Meeting.
 - (iii) Appoint sub-committees for such purposes as they may consider desirable.
 - (iv) Fill any vacancy occurring by death, resignation or otherwise between the Annual General Meetings.
 - (v) Deal with any point not provided for in the Rules of the Club.
 - (vi) Appoint the Captains of the England National, Mackinnon and other teams.
 - (vii) Remove the name of any member from the list of members for any reason that they may consider sufficient. No member who shall be struck off under this Rule shall have any claim on the Club for any subscription or entrance fees paid.
 - (b) Eight members of the Council shall constitute a quorum.
 - (c) The day to day management of the Club shall be delegated to an Executive Committee consisting of the President, the Chairman of Council, the Honorary Secretary and the Honorary Treasurer. They shall have the power to deal with such administrative matters as may be necessary for the

smooth running of the Club within parameters set from time to time by Council, such as Police and Home Office matters, executing decisions taken by Council, maintaining relationships with other organisations, management reporting systems and so on (but this is not an exhaustive or exclusive list). The Executive Committee may co-opt other members of the Club as necessary to assist in fulfilling these tasks. The Executive Committee shall not have power to dispose of any assets of the Club or change the Rules of the Club.

10. Vice-Presidents

The Club shall be entitled to elect at each Annual General Meeting Vice-Presidents from amongst its members in accordance with the provisions of Rule 8(g) who shall retire annually but be eligible for re-election. Vice-Presidents shall not be members of the Council unless they make the declaration specified in Rule 8(f) in which case they will be Executive Vice-Presidents.

11. Districts and Divisions

- (a) In order to facilitate the organisation of the Club, England shall be divided into Districts, each District being placed under the supervision of a District Superintendent. In addition there shall be separate Divisions covering the whole Country and devoted entirely to the encouragement of specific disciplines as specified in Bye-law 1.
- (b) Each new District or Divisional Superintendent shall normally be elected at the first Council Meeting of each financial year and remain in position until he or she either resigns or a formal nomination is received by the Honorary Secretary. Should a vacancy arise or members of a District or Division wish to nominate a Superintendent then the procedures identified in Bye-Law 4 shall apply.
- (c) A meeting of the District and Divisional Superintendents shall be held during the Annual Bisley Meeting of the National Rifle Association (NRA). Any District and Divisional Superintendent unable to attend may nominate a deputy.
- (d) If a member wishes to transfer from one District or Division to another, such transfer may be accepted by a Superintendent provided that notice has been given to the Superintendents of both the original and new District or Division. In the case of an objection on the part of either Superintendent the case shall be referred to the Council. In one year a member may only shoot for one District in the KGV.

12. Accounts

- (a) The Accounts of the Club shall be made up to 31 August in each year and shall be examined by an Independent Examiner elected at the previous Annual General Meeting.
- (b) The accounts shall be included in the yearbook and laid before the next Annual General Meeting.

13. General Meetings

(a) There shall be an Annual General Meeting. Members shall be advised of the location, date and time of this meeting at least 28 days beforehand by email to all members with registered email addresses and by a notice on the web site.

- (b) An Extraordinary General Meeting may be called by the Honorary Secretary if Council decides that one is required or on the request of 20 paid up members of the Club. Members shall be advised of the location, date and time of any such meeting at least 28 days beforehand by email to all members with registered email addresses and by a notice on the web site.
- (c) Ten members of the Club shall constitute a quorum.
- 14. In the event of the English Twenty Club for any reason ceasing to exist, the balance of its assets, after meeting all liabilities, shall be transferred to the National Rifle Association or any such other appropriate organisation as shall be decided by the then existing members of the Club.

15. Alteration of Rules

- (a) These Rules shall not be altered except at a General Meeting, and then only by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the members present.
- (b) Notice of a motion for an amendment of these Rules must be given to the Honorary Secretary in writing not less than 35 days prior to the General Meeting at which it will be considered.

Bye-laws 1 - Shooting Disciplines

- 1. The Club supports the disciplines of Target Rifle (TR), 300m, F Class and Gallery Rifle (GR). Service rifle shooters may join the Club in the appropriate TR district but currently there are no specific Club events for the service rifle.
- 2. In accordance with any restrictions currently in force the Club supports target shooting with pistols via the EPA Division.

2 - Approval of Membership

- 1. Applications for membership may be submitted either to the Membership Secretary direct, or through the District or Divisional Superintendents.
- 2. The Membership Secretary shall make any checks deemed appropriate prior to submission of the applications to the Hon Secretary for approval.

Approved by Council 30 October 2011

3 - Subscriptions

- Life Members a single payment of twenty times the annual subscription, reduced to ten times the annual subscription for those over 65, to be made direct to the Honorary Membership Secretary.
- 2. Annual Members £15 a year, due on 1 January, to be paid to the Club by means of a standing order, bank transfer or via the District or Divisional Superintendent. Standing order forms are available on the web site. Contact the treasurer for details of payment by bank transfer.
- For a single subscription of three times the current annual subscription, a
 person under the age of 25 is eligible to become an Under 25 Member until the
 end of the year in which the 25th birthday occurs, subject to the provisions for
 admission set out in Rule 3.

Bye-laws

4. The affiliation fee for Schools and Cadet Units is twice the annual subscription for individual members.

Approved by Council 31 March 2016

4 - Election Procedure for District and Divisional Superintendents

- A nomination may be made by any two members of the District or Division. Such nomination, duly signed, must be sent to the Honorary Secretary not later than 30 September. The current Superintendent may offer to continue without any nomination.
- If there is more than one candidate there shall be a ballot of all members of the
 District or Division. The ballot may be postal or by electronic communication as
 considered appropriate by Council for the District or Division at the time. The
 procedure shall be determined by Council to achieve a result that can be
 published by 31 December.
- 3. If no new nomination is received before 30 September, the Council shall have power to re-appoint the Superintendent currently in office, or to appoint any other member of the District or Division to the office. If a Superintendent retires, and he nominates a successor, the Council may at their discretion accept this nomination without recourse to the members of the District or Division. However, if no such nomination is made and the members of the District or Division do not themselves nominate a successor, the Council shall fill the vacancy.

Approved by Council 30 October 2011

5 - Prize Winners

- Members winning Club prizes are expected to receive them at the prize giving. Members shall be advised of the location, date and time of the prize giving at least seven days beforehand.
- 2. All Club trophies must be returned to the Honorary Secretary at the English Twenty Club Spring Prize Meeting for engraving, and at the latest by the NRA Inter-counties weekend (mid-June) if already engraved. If a trophy which has been accepted and signed for is not returned in the same condition as it was received the holder will be liable for the cost of any repair or cleaning required and will not be eligible to take away any trophies in the future. The Varley Trophy must not be polished.

6 - School and Cadet Unit Affiliations

- Each affiliated school or cadet unit receives a bronze jewel and access to the English Twenty Club Yearbook.
- Those attending Bisley Camp during the NRA meeting are urged to take the opportunity to meet club members from their home districts so that they may more easily continue shooting with local clubs when they leave their school or cadet unit.
- 3. However, after they leave, only those of English nationality are eligible to become members of the English Twenty Club.

Approved by Council 31 March 2016

7 - District and Division Jewels

- In each district or division having eight members a bronze jewel is awarded; for each additional 12 members, a further jewel is awarded. If a district or division qualifies for more than one jewel, one is silver; if more than five, two are silver. For example, a District with a membership of 68 is entitled to two silver and four bronze jewels. In each district a further bronze jewel is awarded for young or novice shooters.
- In each district entitled to at least two jewels, a further bronze jewel is awarded
 for young or novice shooters. This jewel is referred to as XB; it is exempt from
 the requirements of paragraphs 4 and 5. If this jewel is not presented in any
 year it must be returned to the Membership Secretary.
- The number of jewels is determined by the membership in the preceding year (by the number of life members, plus the number of annual subscriptions received).
- 4. Only life members and members who have paid their subscriptions for the current year prior to their jewel shoot are eligible to take a jewel. They may only shoot for jewels in the district or division in which they are registered.
- 5. Those registered in a division in addition to a district may shoot for both sets of jewels, but may only win one jewel in any year. A member who, after the first of the two jewel shoots, qualifies for a jewel must elect whether to accept that jewel before the competition for the second.
- Jewels should be shot for before 31 October each year, with conditions arranged locally. Wherever possible, the competition should be held on a range within the district.
- Results must be returned to the Membership Secretary no later than 15 November.

Selection of England Team Captains

The following arrangements for the Selection of Team Captains have been agreed by the Club Council:

National Match Captaincy

The criterion for being nominated as National Match Captain is agreed as follows:

In recognition of outstanding service to English fullbore shooting.

As a guidance note, such service is likely to have been as a Club, County or Cadet Official, or as an English Twenty Club District Superintendent or Council Member.

Team Captain Selection

Mackinnon Captaincy

The criterion for being nominated as Mackinnon Match Captain is agreed as follows:

In recognition of success as captain or coach of, or as a shooter in, England teams.

As a guidance note, the person selected is also likely to be a successful team leader.

Procedure for Nomination and Selection of National and Mackinnon Captains

The procedure for nomination and selection of National and Mackinnon Captains is as follows:

- 1. Any English Twenty Club member may propose an appropriate candidate to his District Superintendent.
- The DS shall obtain the agreement of the candidate to the nomination, then pass the proposal in writing to the Hon. Secretary of the Club, no later than one week before the Spring Meeting so that the nomination can be considered for the following year's appointments.
- The Hon. Secretary forwards the nomination to the Captaincy Subcommittee no later than three days before the Spring Meeting. This Sub-committee consists of all current Executive Vice-Presidents and Past Presidents.
- 4. The Captaincy Sub-committee submits short lists of candidates to the Council at the meeting held during the NRA Imperial Meeting.
- 5. Council votes to elect the Captains for the following year, which are announced before the end of the NRA Imperial Meeting.

Note that all nominations are forwarded to the Captaincy Sub-committee for consideration; the Sub-committee may also make its own nominations.

Other Matches

The Captaincy Sub-committee also makes recommendations to Council regarding the captains of other England teams for all disciplines supported by the Club as well as English Twenty Club teams. Members should follow the procedure above referring to the appropriate Divisional Superintendent for disciplines other than TR.

Treasurer's Report 2019

Treasurer's Report 2019

Accounts – Year to 31 August 2019

Referring to the attached draft accounts, I set out highlights below:

- The club's net assets have increased from £20,353 to £24,619 during the period
- Provisions (amounts owed by the club) of £2,680 have been made in respect of:
- delayed payments for GR match entry fees £366.30
- payment to the England Rifle Team to Canada for team match entry fees £1,893.75
- yearbook costs £219.84
- o affiliation fee to the City Rifle Club £200.00
- Debtors (amounts owed to the club) of £2,188 relate to amounts received after the balance sheet date in respect of shooter contributions to the cost of the Armed Forces Match, entry fees for the KGV, and amounts due in respect of the Spring Meeting.
- Income from annual subscriptions rose from £6,493 to £6,896 possibly due to increased efforts on the part of the MemSec and DSs to collect annual subscriptions and to persuade more members to pay each year in January by standing order.
- Income from donations fell from £1,711 to £1,250. Council will recall that £486 of the previous year's donations arose in respect of sales of old journals and yearbooks. Donations arise mainly from standing orders for £10 or £5 that have not been increased to the current annual subscription level.
- The Spring Meeting generated a surplus of £3,998, down from £4,203 last year. Revenue increased by £3,662 due to an increased entry. However, costs increased by £3,867 due to a massive increase in the costs of markers. Thanks are due to the organisers for again making the meeting a success
- The KGV generated increased surplus partly due to the release of a £1,200 provision, made last year in respect of targets and markers for the final not subsequently charged for by NSC
- Last year's yearbook loss of £227 was reduced to £163 this year. Less yearbooks were printed, but they were sold at higher prices. Thanks are due to Stephen Penrose for his work as editor
- The costs of international team matches increased by £2,117 partly due to the increased costs arising from the America Match, U-25 America Match and associated badges etc. at the 150th Imperial Meeting

- CCV entry revenue remained flat compared to last year but the cost of prizes and medals increased by £255, resulting in a reduced surplus
- The loss on sales of merchandise increased from £354 to £500.
 In view of very slow sales of club and team pullovers, the Executive Committee decided to write down the stock (of pullovers) by a further 25%, attributing zero value to these items, which can still be purchased at attractive prices
- The club incurred costs of £2,479, up from £1,471 last year, in relation to target hire and markers in support of the England Lions programme. This increase was partly due to the costs arising from the training match in May, against the England Team to Canada.

Management Update

Annual subscription collection.

2019 revenue from subscriptions and from recurring donations increased during the year. This is commendable and largely, I suggest, due to the efforts of Ben Craig and, subsequently Graham Nelson in their role as MemSec. Post the Balance sheet date Graham Nelson has put in tremendous work on the new membership database and is actively chasing subscription payments both directly and through DSs. Council is encouraged to find ways to increase the numbers of members who pay by Standing Order. All new annual members are required to pay by SO.

Categorisation of Revenue Streams.

In order that the treasurer can report accurately to Council, it is important that members, when they pay money to the club by electronic means, use the club's revenue codes to indicate what their payment is for. This is essential if the accounts are to properly reflect the nature of the club's revenues. There are signs of improvement but plenty still needs to be done!

Spring Meeting

This event is very important for the club's revenues; Council should consider what measures are needed to promote greater participation and hence a greater surplus. How do we find 50 more entries as the BCRC has done?

General

Costs incurred supporting England team entry fees at Bisley, and supporting the touring team (to Canada), were about £3,000 more than

in the previous year. Support for England Lions also increased by about £1,000.

These expenses are appropriate so long as the club generates the revenues to support them. I urge Council to ensure that the club runs a healthy financial surplus in the future if it intends to sustain these grants. A shock e.g. the loss of the surplus on the Spring Meeting due to the current virus outbreak, could have serious consequences for the club's ability to support its representative teams, and the Lions.

Secretary's Report for the Year 2019 - 2020

As I write this report I, like most of the members of the Club, am at home hoping to avoid getting the Coronavirus that is impacting all our lives. I know that some of our members have already contracted it and I have no doubt that many more will.

I would like to thank the members of our club that are working in harm's way to try and keep the country functioning as close to normality as possible. There are many professions that have been identified as key and I will not list them for fear of missing one out. I would however, like to make particular mention of the club members that are working for the NHS, you have our deepest gratitude for the work you are doing.

You will without doubt be aware that all NRA organised events at Bisley are suspended until 31st August, and possibly beyond. The ranges will open to civilians when the Government restrictions mean it is safe to do so. As well as the frustration of not getting out on the ranges, it also means that a number of the club competitions will not take place, and if they do, it will not be until much later in the year.

It is with sadness that I report the recent passing of Brian Gill. Brian was often found in the English Twenty Clubhouse, where he carried out many essential maintenance tasks to the building and installed the much-needed log burner. In 2014 Brian was made an honorary life member of the club for his selfless service.

The Spring Meeting

The Club will be hoping for range space to be available in October to hold a meeting, albeit with an amended format.

The Championship and Varley

As the TR Imperial Meeting will not take place, the Championship and Varley will not be held this year. If the NRA hosts a competition later in the

year, then this will be reviewed. The club is very grateful to those members who pay their membership and championship entry by standing order, however if members would like their £10 entry to be returned then please let the treasurer know and a cheque will be sent; please do not amend your Standing Order for 2021.

The KGV

No heats can be held at Bisley before September and it is very unlikely that a final can be scheduled during the latter part of the year with full representative teams from the Counties, therefore this competition will not be held in 2020.

Jewel Competitions

We would like these to go ahead where possible. Whilst I appreciate that this cannot be until later in the year, I would like District Superintendents to make every effort to nominate a shoot or competition where members can compete for their jewels.

These matches have been cancelled and the Captains that have been appointed for 2020 will retain their captaincy for the 2021 matches.

The Lions Talent Development

The Lions programme continues to identify and develop talented shooters from across the country. The club is indebted to Graham Nelson, the management team and the skilled volunteers for their dedication to the delivery of this programme. The squad for 2019-20 has been selected and the first training weekend has been held, with much support from many senior England shooters and Coaches.

As the primary reason for the programme is to prepare shooters for selection for the National Match, the Lions management has decided that this squad will run for two years. This will give members an opportunity to be selected in 2021.

Touring Teams

The club is now on track to maintain a regular programme of sending touring teams to compete in the National Championships of our fellow

nations; Guyana in 2017, Canada in 2019, South Africa and Kenya in 2021 and there is the seedling of an idea for a team to New Zealand in 2024. Whilst it is hoped that the team can still travel to South Africa and Kenya in 2021, the current pandemic may stop it from happening. The team has obviously cancelled the first training weekend due in April, but it is hoped that a training weekend will be possible later in the year.

Changes to club management

Steven Thomas will be stepping down as our treasurer this year, having spent the last 6 years getting a tight grip on the finances of the club and steering us through the handing back of the clubhouse. Whoever steps into the role will have a very clear and healthy set of accounts to take forward and I wish them luck.

Another recent change for the club is the occupier of the Membership Secretary role. Graham Nelson has taken over the reins with his usual enthusiasm and no doubt you will have heard from him in recent weeks. I would like to thank Ben Craig for his time in office and his handover to Graham.

I am stepping down as Hon Sec at the next AGM, but I would like to continue involvement as Competition Secretary for the club. I would like to thank Peter Kelly for organising the KGV competition for many years.

Annual General Meeting

Historically this has been held either during the Spring Meeting or the Main Meeting. As neither of these will be taking place, it is the intention of the Executive to hold the AGM at a convenient date later in the year. Ideally this will be during an Open Meeting hosted by the club.

Commonwealth Games

There has been a positive outcome for shooting in Commonwealth Games, albeit hosted now in India. At this time, it is not known whether TR will be included in the programme.

Club Competitions 2019

English Twenty Club teams had wins in the short and long-range matches against RAFTRC, and for the fourth year in a row, England won the Lawrence Match at Blair Atholl.

The 2019 Imperial Meeting also saw victories for England in The U25 International Match, The Mackinnon, The National Match and The America Match. Unfortunately, in August, the club was unsuccessful in the International match against Wales.

Treasurer's Report 2020

Accounts - Year to 31 August 2020

Referring to the draft accounts (to be issued once they are approved by the Exec Committee), I set out highlights below:

- The club achieved a surplus of £3,486 during the period
- This surplus was achieved after the purchase of wi-fi coaching headsets at a cost to the club of £5,081
- Provisions (amounts owed by the club) of £11,254 have been made in respect of various payments made during the period but for which the cheques had not been presented by 30 September
- Had these cheques been presented in time, the club's cash balance would be £22,687
- Debtors (amounts owed to the club) were zero as all payments were received during the accounting period. This was helped by the Exec Committee's decision not to allow any unpaid entries to shoot the Spring Meeting
- Income from annual subscriptions fell from £6,896 to £6,740.
 This outcome could have been worse had it not been for the continuing efforts of the MemSec (and DSs) to persuade more members to pay each year in January by standing order.
- Income from donations fell from £1,250 to £1,006. Council will
 recall that donations arise mainly from standing orders for £10 or
 £5 that have not been increased to the current annual
 subscription level. This reduction reflects the efforts of the
 MemSec to get more members paying the current annual
 subscription by SO
- The Spring Meeting generated a surplus of £1,427, down from £3,998 last year. This was the Covid year and we are fortunate to have been able to hold the meeting which was extremely well organised.
- The costs of international team matches were much reduced compared to those arising at last year's 150th Imperial Meeting
- CCV entry revenue remained flat compared to last year but the cost of medals and badges was zero, resulting in an increased surplus to the club
- The loss on sales of merchandise reduced from £500 to £110.
 Sales were reduced to £198
- The club's costs arising from the England Lions programme, and from touring teams, were much reduced due to the lack of activity during the year

- In summary, the club could afford the high cost of coaching headsets because it did not have to meet its normal costs arising from international match fees, the Lions programme and supporting touring teams
- Continued success and financial health will rely on continuing surpluses being generated from the Spring Meeting, KGV, Club championship and Varley.

Management Update

As Council is aware, I announced my intention to step down as treasurer, once I had completed the 2020 accounts, nearly 18 months ago. That moment has now arrived!

When I became treasurer, I prepared the 2014 accounts, for the first time on Excel, with help from my predecessor Geoff Atkinson. My first treasurer report, in 2015, disclosed that the club had lost about £40,000 in the previous six years, much of it arising from poor management systems and continuing clubhouse maintenance costs.

After that date Council resolved to dispose of the clubhouse and modernise the whole operation of the club. Under the leadership of your Exec Committee, the clubhouse lease was surrendered, at a further cost of £20,000, and we have achieved financial surpluses every year since. Just as important as the financial turnaround has been the injection of energy and new ideas which has raised the profile of the club and put a spring in the step of England shooting.

The Lions programme now provides uncapped members with a pathway to the reserved slots in the National Match, and provides England Captains with a pool of known talent to select from, talent that has had the benefit of training with our finest shooters, coaches, and trainers who freely give their time and energy to the club.

The clubhouse used to be the club's communication channel and has now been replaced by a fresh and informative website, well managed with regular updates by our volunteer webmasters.

Most recently our new MemSec has tackled the ultimate management challenge: finding out who our members are, which ones are still alive, how many are paying the correct annual subscription, persuading members to pay on 15 January by standing order, and building a data base on Excel. This vital work will enable the CompSec, for the first time, to know whether people who enter the Spring Meeting, or the Club Championship and Varley, or who shoot in KGV teams, are actually members. It will also lead to a more reliable flow of subscription income, and provide vital data for future communication and initiatives.

In conclusion, whilst I can claim little credit for delivery of the aforementioned innovations, it has been an exciting time to be part of the club's management team.

I thank Martin Liversage, with whom I have worked most closely over the last six years. He is the club's biggest asset, the essence of "can do", working behind the scenes and centre stage, and always with a smile on his face. Look after him!

I also thank Tom Rylands and Mick Barr with whom, along with Martin, it has been a pleasure to work on the Exec Committee. Tom brings leadership and is at the core of our shooting world. His connections ensure that nothing happens without the club being aware. Mick, our president, has a depth of knowledge and experience of the world of Bisley which is second to none.

I thank members of Council, for supporting the positive changes, and encourage them to keep innovating to keep the club relevant. Finally, I thank Judy, my accountant wife, who has helped me to take my Excel skills "to another level".

We have one member of Council stepping down, Dick Rosling. To him I add my special thanks for unstinting service as a DS, which he continues to do and for his experience, wisdom and counsel that he has brought to meetings and which I hope we can call on in the future when needed.

I wish to particularly mention the retiring officers, Martin Liversage and Steven Thomas. I can honestly say that the English XX owes an eternal debt to them both. Martin has served tirelessly as secretary for over 9 years, is a founding organiser of the Lions, has taken on the running of the Spring Meeting and as if he wasn't busy enough, is Adjutant for the upcoming England Tour to South Africa! English County Rifle Championship

for the King George V Challenge Cup

under the auspices of the English Twenty Club

General Rules

 There shall be an Annual Competition for a team Rifle Championship amongst the Districts of England defined by the Club. Each team shall be composed of shooters who are current members of the English Twenty Club, or pupils at Schools or Cadet Units affiliated to the Club and who are eligible to shoot for England in the National Match.

The particular District for which a person is qualified to shoot is decided by one of the following:

- (a) Birth³, county of birth of parents or grandparents.
- (b) Residential Parliamentary Vote. Should a member have no such vote he is deemed to have one in the same place as his next of kin.
- (c) After holding a Residential Parliamentary Vote in the District for ten consecutive years a person may opt for that District even though he ceases to be resident in the District.
- (d) A peer may shoot for the District in which he resides.

A member must be registered with the District for which he elects to shoot.

Captains, Adjutants and Coaches must be fully qualified to shoot in their Teams.

2. The championship shall be decided by tournament with Districts grouped into regions. The Districts winning their regional heats shall compete in the Final. If a heat winner is unable to field a team for the Final, the District that came second in the heat shall be given the opportunity to shoot in the Final. The DS

³ Where the District in which is situate the place of birth of a member is subsequently changed, such member may elect to shoot for either the original or the new District, but having once shot for the District of his election he shall at all times hereinafter be precluded from shooting for the other District.

of the winning District is responsible for informing the second District and the Executive Committee. The District winning the Final is the Champion for the year.

Final

- 3. The King George V Challenge Cup shall be held for the year by the Champion District. The Cup is to be returned to the Honorary Secretary or a member of the Executive Committee by the end of the English Twenty Club Spring Meeting of the year following that in which it was won.
- 4. Up to 12 "gold" badges will be given to the winning team, up to 12 "silver" badges to the second team, and up to 12 "bronze" badges to the third team in the Final.
- 5. The Match conditions for the Final shall be:
 - Teams shall be a maximum of twelve a side, consisting of eight firers all to count, two coaches, one Captain and one Adjutant.
 - There shall be two targets per team.
 - Two convertible sighting shots only per firer, per range, are allowed.
 Practice shots are not allowed.
 - The course of fire shall be ten shots to count per firer at 300, 500 and 600 yards.
 - The time limit is one hour at each range.
 - Team members must use 7.62mm (.308") ammunition.
 - Any rifle included in the NRA Target Rifle classification for the current year may be used.
 - In the absence of any local rule, NRA rules shall apply.
- 6. The Final shall normally take place at Bisley Camp on First Thursday of the Imperial Meeting. If circumstances prevent this, the Executive Committee shall make alternative arrangements. Any ammunition may be used provided all participating District Superintendents agree; otherwise ammunition will be issued. The charge to each team entering the Final will be for target hire, markers, Range Officers and, if issued, for ammunition, all at cost.
- Any District that has been provided with a range and an agreed date but fails to compete shall be held to be beaten but must pay for facilities provided in good faith.

Heats

- 8. The Match conditions for the heats shall be as for the Final where possible. In addition:
 - Two or more Districts may apply to shoot as one team in special circumstances. All Districts in the region (see below) must agree the request, which must be submitted to the Executive Committee for ratification at least two weeks before the heat is due to take place.
 - In addition to the cost of targets, etc., the entrance fee for the competition must be paid before shooting to the District Superintendent organising the heat; any team failing to do this shall be disqualified. The entry fee for the current year will be published on the web site.

- Dispensation may be granted by the Executive Committee of the English Twenty Club in relation to the number of firers, the number of shots and distances. The minimum number of firers for a heat shall be six. Where teams have six shooters or more the minimum course of fire shall be two convertible sighters and seven shots to count per firer at 300, 500 and 600 yards. If some teams in a region can field a full team of eight but others can only raise n (where n is between six and seven), the teams with eight select the top n scores.
- The time limit is decided by the Captains.
- The heats must take place by the end of June in each year. Each region shall be organised by one of the District Superintendents in the region, following in alphabetical order of District name. Details shall be agreed with the other District Superintendents concerned, and failing agreement as determined by the Executive Committee. The organising District Superintendent shall provide targets and range officers. Ammunition must comply with NRA rules, and will be provided by participating teams. If requested by a participating team, the organising District Superintendent must provide ammunition for that team.
- The regions are:

North: Cheshire, Lancashire, Northumberland and Durham,

Yorkshire

Midlands: Derbyshire, Lincolnshire, Northamptonshire,

Leicestershire and Rutland, Nottinghamshire, Warwickshire, Staffordshire and Shropshire,

Worcestershire and Herefordshire

West: Cornwall, Devon, Dorset, Gloucestershire, Somerset East: Bedfordshire, Cambridgeshire, Essex, Hertfordshire,

Norfolk, Suffolk

South: Berkshire, Buckinghamshire, Hampshire, London,

Oxfordshire, Wiltshire

Home Counties: Kent, Surrey, Sussex

- The completed scores shall be certified by the Captains and sent the day after the match to the Honorary Competitions Secretary of the English Twenty Club on team registers supplied by the Honorary Competitions Secretary.
- 9. The winning team in each heat will receive up to 12 badges.

Note: the abbreviation KGV is used for the name of this competition in subsequent sections.

Rules of the "National Challenge Trophy" Ordered by the Council of the National Match

(Revised in 2019)

- 1. There shall be an Annual Match known as "The National Match" between English, Scottish, Irish, and Welsh Teams.
- 2. There shall be one team for each of the Nationalities. Each team may include a captain, adjutant, main coach, up to 5 coaches and up to 5 reserves and shall include 20 shooting members up to a maximum of 33 members.
- 3. (a) The test of nationality shall be either
 - (1) Country of birth, or
 - (2) Descent from parents or grandparents who were qualified by country of birth or
 - (3) Country of residence for a continuous period of not less than five years immediately preceding the date of the Match.
 - (b) A person who has been a member of a team of one of the Nationalities specified in Rule 1 in the National Match or in any match under the direction or control of the NRA shall not thereafter be eligible to shoot for another Nationality in the National match.
 - (c) A person who has been a member of a team which has shot against any Nationality for which he is qualified to shoot under paragraph (a) of this Rule or against Great Britain, in any match under the direction or control of the NRA may not be a member of a team in the National match during the following two-and-a-half-years.
 - (d) A person may not be a member of a team in the National Match in any year in which he is a member of an officially accredited Overseas Team.
 - (e) A person who has been a team member for a particular country under the rules in force at that time shall remain qualified to shoot for that country in perpetuity.
 - (f) Participation in the NRA Cadet International Match or any cadet competition does not count for the purposes of Rules 3(b) or 3(c).
- 4. The National Match shall normally take place at the Annual Meeting of the National Rifle Association at Bisley, but every fourth year it may be held at another venue within the United Kingdom determined by each Nationality in alphabetical order i.e. England, Ireland, Scotland, Wales starting with Scotland in year 2008. If that Nationality cannot hold the Match, the next Nationality in the rota will organise the Match away from Bisley. The Council of the XX Club of the Nationality whose turn it is to organise the Match away from Bisley shall notify in writing the other XX Clubs and the NRA not later than 15th October following the last Match of the date and place in the United Kingdom of the Match for the ensuing year.
- (a) All matters concerning the National Match, not by these rules placed within the province of the Team Captain shall be in the charge and control of the Council of the National Match.
 - The Council shall consist of a President and the Captain and two other Representatives of each Nationality.

- The President of the Council shall be appointed for one year by each Country in turn in alphabetical order, i.e., England, Ireland, Scotland, Wales.
- (b) The Council shall elect an Honorary Secretary, who need not be a member of the Council, to serve for such a period as the Council shall determine.
- (c) A Meeting of the Council may be convened at any time by the Honorary Secretary at the request of the President or of any of the Captains.
 - Any such Meetings shall be summoned by at least 14 days' notice in writing to every member of the Council. Such notice shall specify the place, day and hour of the Meeting and the general nature of the business to be transacted.
 - Length of such notice may be reduced at the discretion of the President if the urgency of the business to be discussed in his opinion so requires.
- (d) At all Meetings of the Council every member shall be entitled to one vote upon every question raised. In the case of equality of votes the President shall have a second or casting vote. In the absence of the President the members present shall elect one of their members to act as Chairman. A Chairman so elected shall in the event of equality of votes have a second or casting vote.
- (e) The quorum at all meetings of the Council shall be seven.
- The XX Club Council of each Nationality shall in such manner and for such term of office as it may think fit elect or cause to be elected the Captain of the Team of its own Nationality and its other Representatives on the Council of the National Match.
- 7. (a) In the event of the Match being held elsewhere than at Bisley the Captain of the team in whose Country the Match is to be held shall be responsible in consultation with the other Captains, for all arrangements in connection with the Match.
 - (b) Each Captain shall be responsible for all the matters in connection with his team including the selection and conduct of its members and he shall have the absolute control of his team in all matters relating to the Match.
 - (c) Each Captain shall nominate an Adjutant who shall deputise for him in the event of circumstances preventing him from fulfilling any of the duties of his office.
 - (d) Each Captain shall appoint an Umpire unless the Captains of all competing teams agree to appoint one Umpire only.
- 8. The following conditions shall apply to the National Match:
 - (a) The rules of the NRA current for the year of the Match as to ranges, targets, arms, scoring and position for the first stage of the Queen's Prize shall normally apply.
 - (b) At each range the number of shots shall be seven with one convertible sighter.
 - (c) Unless the Captains of all competing teams otherwise agree only such ammunition as issued at the Meeting where the Match is held shall be used.
 - (d) There may be Check-Register Keepers at each firing point.
 - (e) In all matters not provided for by these Rules the current Rules of the NRA shall apply.

9. These Rules may be revoked, added to or altered by a majority of at least two-thirds of the members of the Council present at any Meeting of the Council held at Bisley during the NRA Meeting and summoned by at least 28 days' notice in writing to all members of the Council specifying the intention to propose the revocation, addition or alteration together with full particulars thereof.

Rule 5 (e) shall apply to any such Meeting.

For clarification the XX Club Councils referred to in Para 6 above refer to the Councils of the English Twenty Club, the Irish Rifle Club (Bisley), the Scottish XX Council and the Welsh Rifle Association.

Guidelines for National Team Selection

The Club Council at its meetings on 1 June 1952 and 24 May 1953 resolved that the following policy should be followed when selecting the National team.

- (a) The team and reserves should be selected from those competing in the English Twenty Club Championship.
- (b) The winner of the Queen's Prize in the preceding year, if qualified under (a), should be included in the team.
- (c) Half the team should consist of those who have not shot more than once before; at least five should not have shot in the National match at all before.
- (d) The five reserves should never before have shot or been a reserve in this match.

District Superintendents are requested to notify the Captain of promising shooters in their districts.

The tour began with the team venturing to Quebec to celebrate the ARPQ/PQRA's 150th Anniversary. This was the first time a touring team from the UK had visited since 1972! Our hosts were very happy to see us. and the hospitality of the Quebecois was exceptional. The view of the Valcartier range was spectacular, backing out onto a large wooded hill. The range only goes back as far as 600 so to make things more challenging 400x is shot on the 300x target. Whilst the sight picture is not unlike our long range, the buls and other scoring rings are much smaller! The PQRA (ATPQ in French) hold their Provincial Meeting over two days with a team shoot at the end of the first day at 600 yards. Our Captain. Tom Rylands, having collected in plot cards and consulted with his management team, selected 5 teams of four, with a few being granted dedicated coaches. Each team was asked to select a suitably witty name, which resulted in: Last Chance Saloon, England Extractors, Machine Gun Crew, English Roses, and U25. The Last Chance Saloon team won, with 199.20 in some light changeable wind conditions. Following on from the shooting, the team were invited to dinner at a local Quebec restaurant, where prizes for the day were presented. This gave Tom the opportunity to practice his French and to present the PQRA (ATPQ in French) with an EnglishXX Silver Salver, which had been commissioned using donations from two members of the 1972 team and the EXX club. We hope to see this used as a future trophy in the PQRA provincial meeting. Day 2 in Quebec saw the end of the Grand Aggregate, with a final shoot at 500 and 600 yards – far more friendly than the previous day's shoot at 400 yards. 15 members of the team made it through to the Governor General's final, taking the individual scores from Day 1 and 2's shoots at 500 and 600 yards. The Vice-captain, Andrew, donned his birthday tiara for extra luck. Highlights of the shooting over both days involved: David Nuthall winning the Grand Aggregate - having dropped only 1 point, Jon Underwood coming 2nd in the Governor's General Final – scoring the only 75 in the final, Katherine Fleck claiming the Top U25 place in the Grand by beating Saxon Brewer-Merchant by a mere V bull.

Gale Stewart, Chairman of the PQRA, generously acted as our guide on a walking tour of Quebec City in the morning of the 3rd day in Quebec, with the team having moved to Quebec City itself. We managed to avoid the worst of the hills, whilst still capturing the beauty of the city and the views of the St Lawrence River as we walked along the heights of Abraham. Whilst we were in the area, we paid a visit to Montmorency on the 2nd R&R day. The waterfall is 15 minutes east of the city, and provided a spectacular day out. The Montmorency Falls are taller than the well known Niagara Falls, measuring 84m in total height and have a zipline crossing right over the top of it. Having proved themselves on the zipline some of the team

went on to partake in Via Ferrata where they were soon scaling the mountain itself.

Following on from this adventurous outing, the team drove down to Ottawa, in preparation for the DCRA meeting in the coming days. Sneaking in a practice at 800m allowed the team to get some zeroes with the ammunition provided by the captain. This was indeed valuable for all the team, with every member scoring at least a 74 in our first shoot at Connaught ranges – The Ottawa Regiment. Paul Wheeler and Jon Underwood tied for first place on 75.14, with a tie shoot occurring later in the week which Jon won. Over the next 7 days individual performances of the team were exceptional – every member of the team was able to claim a Canadian HPS – with the weather and wind playing huge roles in the overall shoots of the range.

The evenings in Canada proved enjoyable, especially the one when we and the Welsh hosted the Canadians, Athelings and Canadian cadets. During the lead up to the event, a few brave souls were tasked with locating and securing bottles of Pimms – quite quintessentially British for sure! To aid in the serving of Pimms and to the mood of the evening, a few team members dressed up as Knights and Maidens. What we hadn't quite realised was that the Welsh had a secret weapon – Dragons. Before the end of the evening however, our brave Knights had captured the Dragons and rescued the Maidens!

The effort and talent displayed by the members of the team made selection for the Outlander, Canada match, and the Commonwealth matches incredibly tricky! The Outlander helped act as a rehearsal for the Canada match, providing Tom and management extra information about how people performed in a team setting. We entered three teams, with the USA and Wales providing teams to compete against. The "British Isles" team won with 1174.122, with Nigel Ball top scoring for the team with an impressive 150.21.

The Canada match is for a team of 15 (Captain, Adjutant, 8 shooters, 3 coaches and 2 reserves). Those selected were: Tom Rylands (Captain), Archie Whicher (Adjutant), Nigel Ball, Chris Mitchell, Tom Smith, Katherine Fleck, Jeremy Tuck, David Rose, Paul Wheeler and David Nuthall (Shooting), Jon Underwood (Main coach), Andrew Lothian, Stephen (Coaches), James Penrose Postle and Andy "Turbo" (Reserves/plotters). The rehearsal with the Outlander proved invaluable, as the team won the Canada match scoring 1185.117, beating Canada by 4 points (1181.127). The U25s had their own shoot to compete in alongside the Canada match: The team consisted of Harriet Bramwell, Jack Keates, Jemima Hince, Saxon Brewer-Merchant and Ben Danzinger (pinched from the Atheling team). Coaching amongst themselves, they put on an impressive display to win the U25 International Short Range Match, scoring 734.71, with Canada scoring 730.69, and the U25 GB Atheling squad scoring 721.51. This was the second time ever an England team had won the Canada match, the last occasion being in 1995. The team put this down

to the Captain bringing along a "secret weapon" – a teapot! Coupled with the U25 winning their match, this prompted much celebration that evening. We also celebrated our 4th birthday of the tour the same evening, so plenty for all to be merry about.

The last day of competition sees the second International match - The Commonwealth, and the final of the Governor General's prize. With a slightly larger team size, and the U25s having their own version of the shoot, everyone was involved in some manner or other for The Commonwealth. Regrettably, the team was not able to repeat their performance of the previous day, with a tricky wind and a series of imperfections leading to our loss to both the Canadians and the American "Goodwill" team (Canada 1182.119, USA 1164.107, England 1153.93, Wales 1112.64). The U25s for England also struggled, coming 3rd to the U25 GB (Atlhings) by 2Vs and just 5 points off the Canadian U25 team. The writer would like to note that the England U25s for this match coached within themselves, whereas the other two teams had a dedicated coach (U25 themselves). After a long rest over lunch, members of the team who had made it to the final began making their way out to the range, watching the wind become trickier as the angle had changed through zero once more. As we neared the end of the 900M shoot, it became clearer and clearer that a tight finish may be at hand, with scores of 296s, 297s and 298s flooding the board. However, it was not to be - Jon Underwood showed his mastery of the conditions winning the Governor General's prize with an outstanding 300.30, having not dropped a single point at any distance whatsoever. Nigel Ball finished in 2nd place, with an equally respectable 298.37, beating Canada's Bruce Bullock by 2vs.

"Jon's smile nearly outshone the afternoon sun as he was warmly congratulated by all and sundry. As tradition demands, he was chaired off the range, a somewhat lighter load than some!" A small exert from our tour diary captures the mood perfectly.

Some highlights of that evening at prize giving, taken from our diary entry:

- Jon Underwood was first up for the Ottawa Regiment, which he won in an Old Guildfordian affair, tie shooting against Paul Wheeler; Jon obviously starting as he meant to go on.
- Chris Mitchell took the Champlain Aggregate, the Agg of all the pre Grand shoots.
- Nigel Ball the Sailor visited front and centre to collect the President's, whilst Lucinda Taylor and Clare Halloran won the Ladies Pairs.
- A "British Isles" team won the Outlander Angus McLeod helped us out there!

- Our U25s shot alongside the "Senior" team during the Canada and won their International Short range match.
- Most notably, the Champion Pairs were won by a curiously named pair - the "Buggy Buddies", aka Ball and Rose. These two had spent the week two stroking around the ranges together and celebrated their win by staying on their "wheels" to collect their prize, leaving a whiff of two stroke oil in the marquee. Generously, our Canadian friends did see the funny side!
- Chairing in our Governor General's winner was our next highlight.
 We managed to not decapitate him as we brought him into the tent.

Prize giving complete, the team assembled on the steps of the DCRA HQ for a quick couple of photos grabbed as darkness fell and then headed out for a night of celebration.

The 300m rifle discipline is organised by the GB300m Rifle Club who own the Electronic targets in use on the 300m range, which is located at the left hand end of the shed on Century range. The 300m range is only available 12 weekends a year; dates for competitions and training can be found on the GB300m club web site:

There are ten lanes of KME electronic targets; all shots are plotted on a monitor next to the shooter and a printout is available at the end of the shoot.

The GB 300m club runs a number of competitions over the year, the majority of which are 60 shots prone, but three positional shooting is permitted. A 60 shots prone match has the following format:

300m Events

- 15 minutes preparation time, dry firing is allowed.
- 15 minutes sighting time, unlimited sighting shots are allowed.
- The stop command is given, the targets are cleared by the range officer and you are given the command to start your match.
- No more sighters, 60 shots to count in 60minutes.

The range is the premier 300m range in the country. The NRA and English Twenty Club championships, trials and training for the 300m GB team, and visiting European teams are just some of the events held during the year. All events and results can be found on the GB300m club web site.

The GB 300m club is the home of the GB international team, which competes in ISSF events including World and European Championships and European Cup competitions.

Teams and individuals competed for Great Britain in three Lapua European Cups, the Lapua European Cup final and the European Championships. Winners of the 300m domestic competitions are posted on the GB 300m club web site.

Gallery Rifle Division

The 2019 season witnessed the England team complete for full England colours for the first time. Our Home Counties National match held annually at the Gallery Rifle National Championships late August/early September hosts the match and always (barring one year) has a full complement of teams. This now being our full colours honours match our half colours are now awarded to the national/international concurrent matches shooters held at the Phoenix Meeting. Four new shooters earned half colour honours at this year's Phoenix meeting.

Results from our Home Countries matches throughout 2019 are documented below. England rifle teams continue to shoot very well in all matches we compete in. We again topped out on the concurrent team matches at the Phoenix meeting and won the HCNM match at the Gallery Rifle National Championships with a clear bullet score of 14 points (max possible score 3360). This match contained two new competitors shooting for England in their inaugural match.

Only two 'official' touring teams in 2019. Winning in Wales at a head to head match as part of the Welsh Gallery Rifle Open meeting but losing (again) to the Welsh at the Derby Open. The Scots were unable to afford the range time at their 2019 Spring meeting for a head to head but we may have a solution to that this season with some canny squadding and efficient range officiating.

We are continuing to push LBR and LBP shooting within the club (and generally). LBP shooting is much more popular than the centrefire Long Barrel Revolver. There are more than one or two reasons for this but overall its probably the general availability of LBPs which are cheap to shoot (22lr). With little or no after market effort or expense these can be shot to a very competitive standard. LBP/LBR team matches are now cemented as a staple in our larger meetings but we have yet to make the decision to offer them as stand alone head to head affairs.

We also reintroduced our season long GR&P Club Championship in 2019. From a competitor's perspective this was just a turn up and shoot affair. From a stats perspective appropriate scores from all our classified meetings were scraped and collated into a 'best 4 to count' league table for all four of our gun types. We had enough people shooting this to make it a season long competition but the jury is out to how much additional interest in the competitive circuit it generated.

LBP/LBR pistol shooting continues to be a prime focus for 2020. We will to continue to encourage more people to shoot the pistol matches at a competitive level with a longer term objective of producing teams to be able to compete at all our major meetings. As well as the usual physical

competitions there is also talk of running some virtual 'postal' style events which may alleviate pressures on time and travel for many.

For the 2020 season David Guest will continue as England captain with Gary Bowden assisting as Vice-Captain. Gary is also taking on the roll as NRA GB captain for the 2020 season so we will be actively seeking new people to assist in officiating the team from 2021 onwards.

From an administrative perspective Neil Francis will continue as Gallery Rifle Division superintendant.
