Subs & Sort Code

A final appeal on the latter point:

PLEASE MAKE SURE YOU'RE USING THE CORRECT SORT CODE. Long story short: when one bank took over another the account number stayed the same, but the sort code changed, albeit that it "forwarded" to the new one for a while. The old sort code WILL STOP WORKING at the end of this year, so subs sent using the old sort code, either transfer or standing order, WILL NOT BE RECEIVED.

Also: If you are not using a standing order then please do so. This saves a lot of time for the membership secretary, treasurer and District Superintendents in identifying and chasing renewals.

If you do not enter the Championship and Varley at the same time then please do so. Simply modify your standing order to £25, covering £15 subs and £10 CC&V entry. This significantly reduces your risk of accidentally not entering and so not being eligible for prizes, or for National Match selection.
