Be Proud of Your Club

We have a splendid range of ties, badges, polo shirts and other items, which can be purchased by members. There is an order form at the back of this yearbook, or you can download an order form from the website.

The club blazer badge with rose and crown logo is available to all members. The rose and crown logo appears also on the navy blue polo shirt and sweatshirt. Both garments are cotton; they are available in sizes M, L, XL and XXL.

The club tie has a rose logo and silver XX symbol.

Half Colours: Half colours badges are awarded in matches where an England team competes against the Home Countries and/or other international teams in a discipline or under conditions in which it is not possible to achieve full colours and the match is recognised by the NRA as having international status. At the present time only the Under 25s international match shot during the Bisley Annual Prize Meeting and the international gallery rifle match competed for during the August Bank holiday weekend qualify for half colours.

Half colour blazer badges are undated and bear respective underscrolls reflecting each match discipline/condition and may be purchased for £6.00.

Full Colours: The team blazer badge may be worn by Captains, adjutants, shooters and coaches of past and present England teams for the National, Mackinnon, Commonwealth Games and the Millennium Match. Touring team full members and officers may wear the three lions logo underpinned by an appropriate scroll showing the tour venue and date. For F Class teams, the date will be followed by F Class. Those team members may also wear England shoulder flashes.

Other badges: Members selected for and competing in the Lawrence Match are entitled to wear a Lawrence Badge which is dated with the year shot. Members selected for and competing in European Short and Long Range matches will be eligible to wear the European Matches badge.

Team members eligible to wear the full colours blazer badge may wear the team sweater that also bears the three lions logo. This is a navy blue V neck pullover (lambs wool blend) available in sizes S, M, L, XL and XXL.

The team tie has a rose logo and gold XX symbol. The cravats for club and team have the same logos as the tie.

We also sell blazer buttons, brooches, lapel buttons and club spoons.

Please order all items from the Honorary Secretary using the form from the website or this yearbook. For garments, please state the size you require.

Postcards and greetings cards of the clubhouse are available from the bar. The design is from a drawing by Margaret Thomson. The postcards are seven for £1; the greetings cards with envelopes are seven for £2.

English Twenty Club Rules

1. The Club shall be called the English Twenty Club.
2. The objects of the Club are to foster target shooting in the interests of National Defence, and in particular to organise the English team in any International match shot in the disciplines covered by the Club (see Bye-law 1).
3. Membership
 - (a) Membership is open only to those eligible to shoot for England under the rules for the time being in force for the National Challenge Trophy Match and who are subjects of The Sovereign.
 - (b) A candidate for membership must be proposed and seconded by members of the Club and approved as specified in Bye-law 2.
 - (c) Members shall be Life Members or Under 25 Members or Annual Members (see Bye-law 3).
 - (d) New Members or Associates (as defined in Rule 6) shall not be admitted to membership or be entitled to any of the privileges of membership specified in Rule 5 unless not less than three days have elapsed from the date of their being proposed and seconded for membership under paragraph (b) of this Rule or elected under Rule 6(a).
 - (e) Members, who subsequently become ineligible for membership under Rule 3(a) by adopting another nationality, may continue in membership and have the privileges given in Rule 5 (a), (b), (c) and (d).
4. Subscriptions
 - (a) Subscriptions shall be paid to the District or Divisional Superintendent (see Rule 11), or direct to the Club as specified in Bye-law 3. Subscription rates are fixed by Council, provided the subscription is not increased by more than the increase in the retail price index since the subscription was last set. If Council needs to impose a greater increase the new subscription must be agreed at a general meeting (see para 13).

(b) Annual Members must pay their subscriptions each year before they take part in any event, decision-making procedure or meeting for Club members. A member who is not active may pay his subscription at any time up to 31 August (the end of the financial year). A member who fails to pay a subscription for two consecutive years may be removed from the list of members. At the Membership Secretary's discretion a lapsed member may pay subscription arrears or may apply to rejoin the Club by completing the current application forms.

5. Privileges of Membership

The privileges of membership are:

- (a) to attend, speak and vote at any general meeting of the Club
- (b) to use the clubhouse at Bisley
- (c) to receive a copy of the yearbook
- (d) to wear the Club blazer badge and tie
- (e) to compete for the Jewels in the District or Division in which registered
- (f) to shoot in any event organised by the Club for its members
- (g) to receive the support of the Club in any efforts that may be made to encourage target shooting for English shooters
- (h) to be considered for selection for the National, Mackinnon and Lawrence matches and for other England and English Twenty Club teams.

Annual Members shall not be entitled to any of the above privileges until they have paid their subscriptions for the current year.

6. Associates

- (a) The Council shall have the power to elect as an Associate any person whose services to the Club or to target shooting in England have been of exceptional value.
- (b) Associates shall pay no subscription and shall have no vote at the Annual General Meeting. They shall have the privileges given in Rule 5 except (e), (f) and (h).

7. Council

- (a) The affairs of the Club shall be managed by and its assets vested in a Council consisting of a President, Past Presidents and Executive Vice-Presidents (see Rule 9) subject to (f) below, members as provided for in (b), (c) and (d) below, an Honorary Secretary and an Honorary Treasurer, who may be the same person. For the purposes of the Charities Acts all members of the Council are Trustees.
- (b) Up to nine members shall be elected as stipulated in (e) and (g) below.
- (c) One member shall be nominated by the Combined Services and one member shall be nominated by the Council for Cadet Rifle Shooting. Nominations for these posts must be with the Honorary Secretary by the end of September each year.
- (d) The Captains of the England National and Mackinnon teams shall be ex-officio members of the Council.

The Superintendents of the Divisions together with the Chairman of the District Superintendents Group (or deputy where the Chairman is already a member of the Council) shall be invited annually to be voting members of the Council.

- (e) The President, Honorary Secretary, Honorary Treasurer and the nine members in (b) shall be elected for a period of three years. One third of

the members in (b) above shall retire in rotation in each year, those willing being eligible for re-election at the AGM in accordance with (g) below. All persons covered by this rule must be paid up members of the Club.

- (f) If they intend to act in an executive capacity, the Past Presidents and Vice-Presidents shall declare this annually in writing to the Honorary Secretary within a period of 28 days after the Annual General Meeting. Executive Past Presidents or Executive Vice-Presidents shall be ex-officio members of Council. See also rule 9.
- (g) Any new candidate for election as President, Honorary Secretary or Honorary Treasurer, or for election to the Council may be proposed by the Council or must be nominated in writing by two members of the Club. All candidates for a particular post must be proposed and seconded 35 days before the AGM. Where there are two or more nominations for any of the positions of President, Honorary Secretary or Honorary Treasurer, or where in the case of the nine elected members in Rule 7(b) above there are more nominations than elected places to be filled on the Council, there shall be a ballot of members to determine the outcome. The Council shall determine the method of ballot and other aspects of the administration of the voting procedure not specified in Rule 7(h).
- (h) In the case of the President, Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer, members of the Club shall be accorded one vote for each contested position, and the person polling the highest number of votes for each of the contested positions shall be elected. In the case of the elected members of Council, members of the Club shall be accorded such number of votes as there are available positions, not more than one of which may be given to any one candidate. A member may use none, or any number of their votes as they consider appropriate. The candidates polling the highest number of votes shall be elected. Only paid up members of the Club voting in accordance with Rule 7(g) shall be entitled to vote.

In the event of a tie for the post of President the Chairman of Council shall have a casting vote. In the event of a tie for any other post the President shall have a casting vote.

8. Council Powers and Lease Trustees

- (a) The Council shall have power to:
 - (i) Appoint a chairman of Council from amongst its members.
 - (ii) Make, amend or cancel such Bye-laws or Regulations (subject to the Rules of the Club and provided that they are not contrary to or inconsistent with any of these Rules) as they may consider expedient for the proper working of the Club. Such Bye-laws, and Regulations shall be binding on all members until set aside by the votes of two-thirds of the members present at the Annual General Meeting.
 - (iii) Appoint sub-committees for such purposes as they may consider desirable.
 - (iv) Fill any vacancy occurring by death, resignation or otherwise between the Annual General Meetings.
 - (v) Deal with any point not provided for in the Rules of the Club.
 - (vi) Appoint the Captains of the England National, Mackinnon and other teams.
 - (vii) Remove the name of any member from the list of members for any reason that they may consider sufficient. No member who shall be

struck off under this Rule shall have any claim on the Club for any subscription or entrance fees paid.

- (viii) Appoint not less than two or more than four Lease Trustees of the Club, (and remove them as appropriate). Lease Trustees shall be signatories to any lease or other document relating to the Club's property or real-estate assets.
- (b) Eight members of the Council shall constitute a quorum.
- (c) The Lease Trustees shall be indemnified out of the property of the Club against any liability that they might incur, including expense, in performing their duties as Lease Trustees. The Council shall be indemnified against legal action for a breach of trust, or a breach of duty or negligence, committed by them in their capacity as Trustees while undertaking their legitimate actions as Trustees, and will be covered against liability as long as they have acted honestly and reasonably¹.
- (d) The day to day management of the Club shall be delegated to an Executive Committee consisting of the President, the Chairman of Council, the Honorary Secretary and the Honorary Treasurer. They shall have the power to deal with such administrative matters as may be necessary for the smooth running of the Club within parameters set from time to time by Council, such as the authorisation of expenditure on clubhouse maintenance, licensing issues, Police and Home Office matters, executing decisions taken by Council, maintaining relationships with other organisations, management reporting systems and so on (but this is not an exhaustive or exclusive list). The Executive Committee may co-opt other members of the Club as necessary to assist in fulfilling these tasks. The Executive Committee shall not have power to dispose of any assets of the Club or change the Rules of the Club.

9. Vice-Presidents

The Club shall be entitled to elect at each Annual General Meeting Vice-Presidents from amongst its members in accordance with the provisions of Rule 7(g) who shall retire annually but be eligible for re-election. Vice-Presidents shall not be members of the Council unless they make the declaration specified in Rule 7(f) in which case they will be Executive Vice-Presidents.

10. Intoxicating Liquor

- (a) Licensable activities including the sale of alcohol shall take place in accordance with the details on the Club's licence and the legislation currently in force, currently the Licensing Act 2003 or its successors.
- (b) No person shall be paid at the expense of the Club any commission, percentage or similar payment on or with reference to purchases of intoxicating liquor by the Club; nor shall any person directly or indirectly derive any pecuniary benefit from the supply of intoxicating liquor by or on behalf of the Club to members or guests, apart from any benefit accruing to the Club as a whole.

11. Districts and Divisions

- (a) In order to facilitate the organisation of the Club, England shall be divided into Districts, each District being placed under the supervision of a District Superintendent. In addition there shall be separate Divisions covering the

whole Country and devoted entirely to the encouragement of specific disciplines as specified in Bye-law 1.

- (b) Each new District or Divisional Superintendent shall normally be elected at the first Council Meeting of each financial year and remain in position until he or she either resigns or a formal nomination is received by the Secretary. Should a vacancy arise or members of a District or Division wish to nominate a Superintendent then the procedures identified in Bye-Law 4 shall apply.
- (c) A meeting of the District and Divisional Superintendents shall be held during the Annual Bisley Meeting of the National Rifle Association (NRA). Any District and Divisional Superintendent unable to attend may nominate a deputy.
- (d) If a member wishes to transfer from one District or Division to another, such transfer may be accepted by a Superintendent provided that notice has been given to the Superintendents of both the original and new District or Division. In the case of an objection on the part of either Superintendent the case shall be referred to the Council. In one year a member may only shoot for one District in the KGV.

12. Accounts

- (a) The Accounts of the Club shall be made up to 31 August in each year and shall be examined by an Independent Examiner elected at the previous Annual General Meeting.
- (b) The accounts shall be included in the yearbook and laid before the next Annual General Meeting.

13. General Meetings

- (a) There shall be an Annual General Meeting during the Annual Bisley Meeting of the NRA. Members shall be advised of the date and time of this meeting at least seven days beforehand by means of a notice on the board at the Club. If the Annual Bisley Meeting of the NRA is not held in any year, Council shall decide on the date and time of the Annual General Meeting and shall give members notice in the same way as for an Extraordinary General Meeting (see 13(b) below).
- (b) An Extraordinary General Meeting may be called by the Secretary if Council decides that one is required or on the request of 20 paid up members of the Club. Members shall be advised of the date and time of any such meeting at least 28 days beforehand by means of a notice on the board at the Club, by email to all members with registered email addresses and by a notice on the web site.
- (c) Ten members of the Club shall constitute a quorum.

14. In the event of the English Twenty Club for any reason ceasing to exist, the balance of its assets, after meeting all liabilities, shall be transferred to the National Rifle Association or any such other charitable body as shall be decided by the then existing members of the Club.

15. Alteration of Rules

- (a) These Rules shall not be altered except at a General Meeting, and then only by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the members present.

- (b) Notice of a motion for an amendment of these Rules must be given to the Honorary Secretary in writing not less than 35 days prior to the General Meeting at which it will be considered.

Bye-laws

1 - Shooting Disciplines

The Club's core activity is fullbore Target Rifle (TR) shooting as defined by the NRA. Service rifle shooters may join the Club in the appropriate TR district but currently there are no specific Club events for the service rifle.

The Club also fosters the disciplines of 300m, F Class and Gallery Rifle (GR).

In accordance with any restrictions currently in force the Club supports target shooting with pistols via the EPA Division.

2 - Approval of Membership

1. Applications for membership may be submitted either to the Membership Secretary direct, or through the District or Divisional Superintendents.
2. The Membership Secretary shall make any checks deemed appropriate prior to submission of the applications to the Hon Secretary for approval.

3 - Subscriptions

16. Life Members - a single payment of 20 times the annual subscription reduced to 10 times the annual subscription for those over 65 to be made direct to the Honorary Membership Secretary.

17. Annual Members - £15 a year, due on 1 January, and either to be paid to the District or Divisional Superintendent or direct to the Club by means of a standing order.

18. For a single subscription of three times the current annual subscription, a person under the age of 25 is eligible to become an Under 25 Member until the end of the year in which the 25th birthday occurs, subject to the provisions for admission set out in Rule 3.

4 - Election Procedure for District and Divisional Superintendents

1. A nomination may be made by any two members of the District or Division. Such nomination, duly signed, must be sent to the Honorary Secretary not later than 30 September. The current Superintendent may offer to continue without any nomination.
2. If there is more than one candidate there shall be a ballot of all members of the District or Division. The ballot may be postal or by electronic communication as considered appropriate by Council for the District or Division at the time. The procedure shall be determined by Council to achieve a result that can be published by 31 December.

If no new nomination is received before 30 September, the Council shall have power to re-appoint the Superintendent currently in office, or to appoint any other member of the District or Division to the office. If a Superintendent

retires, and he nominates a successor, the Council may at their discretion accept this nomination without recourse to the members of the District. However, if no such nomination is made and the members of the District or Division do not themselves nominate a successor, the Council shall fill the vacancy

5 - Prize Winners

1. Members winning Club prizes in kind are expected to receive them at the prize giving, which is normally immediately after the Annual General Meeting.
2. Any prize not applied for within seven days of the prize giving shall be forfeited to the Club.
3. All Club trophies must be returned to the Honorary Secretary at the English Twenty Club Spring Prize Meeting for engraving, and at the latest by the NRA Intercounties weekend (mid-June) if already engraved. If a trophy which has been accepted and signed for is not returned in the same condition as it was received the holder will be liable for the cost of any repair or cleaning required and will not be eligible to take away any trophies in the future. The Varley Trophy **must not** be polished.

Selection of England Team Captains

The following arrangements for the Selection of Team Captains have been agreed by the Club Council:

1) Criteria for National Match Captaincy

(a) This is agreed as follows:

“In recognition of outstanding service to English fullbore shooting.”

(b) As a guidance note, such service is likely to have been as a Club or County or Cadet Official or Leader, or as a Twenty Club District Superintendent or Council Member.

2) Criteria for Mackinnon Captaincy

(a) This is agreed as follows:

“In recognition of success as captain or coach of, or as a shooter in, England teams.”

(b) As a guidance note, the selected person will also be a person likely to be a successful team leader.

3) Procedure for Nomination and Selection of National and Mackinnon Captains

The procedure for nomination and selection of National and Mackinnon Captains is as follows:

(a) Any Twenty Club member may propose an appropriate candidate to his District Superintendent.

(b) The candidate's agreement to the nomination first having been obtained, the DS will pass the proposal in writing to the Hon. Secretary of the Club, to be forwarded to the Captaincy Sub-committee. This Sub-committee will comprise all current Executive Vice Presidents.

(c) Proposals can only be considered by the Sub-committee for recommendation to Council at the Imperial Meeting if submitted to the Hon. Secretary no later than the date of the Spring Meeting in that year.

(d) All nominations will be forwarded to the Captaincy Sub-committee for consideration together with the Sub-committee's own nominations

(e) The Sub-committee will finalise a short list for each match, which will be presented to Council for their final decisions.

4) Other Matches

(a) The Captaincy Sub-committee will also make recommendations to Council re captains of England teams for other matches, e.g. the Combined Services and TNT matches; Gallery Rifle international matches; and the Under-25 Team.

Other Information

All Club trophies must be returned to the Honorary Secretary at the English Twenty Club Spring Prize Meeting for engraving, and at the latest by the NRA Inter-counties weekend (mid-June) if already engraved. If a trophy which has been accepted and signed for is not returned in the same condition as it was received the holder will be liable for the cost of any repair or cleaning required and will not be eligible to take away any trophies in the future. The Varley Trophy **must not** be polished.

The English Twenty Club is affiliated to the National Rifle Association with membership number 307.

The English Twenty Club has Home Office approval with reference FRM 92/35/6/44/18 dated 12 August 2010.

The Club President, Prof A.R. Horrocks, will be stepping down from his post at the 2015 Annual General Meeting. On behalf of the club I would like to thank him very much for his service.

The members retiring by rotation during 2015 are T.G. Rylands and G.R. Trembath, may I thank them for their efforts during their periods of office. There also exists a vacancy for an ordinary member on Council.

Notes from the Retiring President

It is with regret that I have decided to not stand for re-election in 2015, but then again, I have been President of the Club for 12 years and such a time span is long enough (if not too long) for one person to occupy this position. It is time for a change and a fresh brain, I guess. I shall, however, continue to work for the Club as a "Past President".

"What is the Job Description?" one might say. Well, when I took the job on, there wasn't one and still isn't, but generally the job of any President

is to provide a source of advice and a steering hand to the officers and members when needed. When I became President, unfortunately we were in need of a new Honorary Secretary at the same time and not being able to find a willing candidate, I filled this post for about the first 6 years and so my presidential role became somewhat blurred with that of Hon Sec! However, since the appointment of Martin Liversage as Honorary Secretary, I have been able to take a more "overseeing" role for which I have to thank him.

One of my first acts as President was to persuade Council to merge the former Hut and Bar Committees with the current Facilities Committee to manage the clubhouse and its activities as a whole, and Toby Lehmann has ably chaired this for the last 10 years or so. During this time the services to members, including meals provided by Debbie during the Spring and Imperial Meetings, have become a standard item which many members enjoy. The Club has attempted to widen its fullbore shooting interests and two new sections for F Class and Gallery Rifle were created, with the latter now having over 40 members. This has enable total club membership to remain in excess of 900 - a very healthy level.

During my tenure I have been helped by some very experienced and able Council members and District Superintendents and I would like particularly to thank our Chairman, Tom Rylands, for all his efforts and especially for his running both the Spring Meeting and Club Championship during the Imperial. Carol Painting and her eye for detail and concern for the Club's operations and the Club archive should be mentioned, as should also the experience and knowledge of the Club's history and its rules offered by our Past President, Robin Pizer. The Club also has a very active group of Executive Vice Presidents who now operate a formal procedure for the selection of England team Captain shortlists for Council to consider at the July Council meeting. Peter Merry, as secretary of the DSs' meeting during the Meeting, is always able to present "grass roots" opinion to both Council and its officers, for which we are all thankful.

One piece of unfinished business is the future of the clubhouse and how the Club may continue to afford its maintenance and running costs – we have obtained a statement from the NRA which now allows us to consider sharing it with another organisation and our Chairman is in discussions at the present time with a possible third party. We do have a break clause in our lease in 2017 which will enable us to relinquish the clubhouse if it proves to be unaffordable. Current calculations show that the annual cost per member of maintenance etc., was almost equal to the old membership fee and so it is not a minor financial item. I hope that we find

a way forward that enables the Club to increase both clubhouse use and to reduce the direct costs.

I shall look forward to working with the new President whoever that might be, and also for the Club to continue to prosper in spite of the ever rising costs facing us and the reduction in availability of ranges away from Bisley.

The Club Yearbook, 2015

Heather has declared that this will be her last year producing the yearbook and I would like to take this opportunity to publicly thank her for her tenacity, generosity and attention to detail. With this announcement in mind, the English Twenty Club is seeking a volunteer to take on responsibility for the yearbook. From 2016 onwards the yearbook will only be available as print on demand for fully paid up members. Full copy will be available from the website.

The Clubhouse

The Club will be opened for the traditional periods of Spring Meeting and Imperial Meeting as well to support members during section events such as Gallery Rifle. Please note that competitors may use hand-loads that conform to NRA Rule 151, rather than the ammunition being issued by the Club. Members wishing to use hand-loads will have to sign a declaration on the Entry Form that their ammunition conforms to Rule 151. Issued ammunition will still be available for purchase.

This meeting is the premier Club event of the year and members are encouraged to participate. In recent years, the clubhouse has been well attended especially on the Saturday when a special evening meal is available and a true club spirit prevails thanks to Debbie and her staff. Please do support your club by entering; costs have been kept down as far as possible but it means we do need an entry of 120 plus to break even.

Gallery Rifle

The 2014 season was busy for England Gallery Rifle shooters. Three head to head matches were organised in 2014 which took the team to the North of England and the West of Wales. as well as the annual Home Countries National Match (HCNM) taking place at Bisley. Derby Rifle and Pistol Club and Haverfordwest Target Shooting Club played most excellent hosts to the teams.

So how did the England tourists do? Well shot I'd say but we were actually outshot. The Welsh were on top form in 2014 and managed to better us in both contests. Their key strength lay in the ability to keep absolutely consistent and high scores in the small-bore elements of the contests. Full results of all the matches can be found in the yearbook.

The season was not a complete Welsh walkover however. The HCNM match at the Gallery Rifle Nationals did see the trophy come back England's way. This was a solid victory for England and captain, Sophie West, who after tanking the team for their commitment throughout the season announced her retirement for family reasons.

District and Division Jewels

In each district or division having 12 members a bronze jewel is awarded; for each additional 12 members, a further jewel is awarded. If a district or division qualifies for more than one jewel, one is silver; if more than five, two are silver. For example, a District with a membership of 72 is entitled to two silver and four bronze jewels. In each district a further bronze jewel is awarded for young or novice shooters. The award of this special bronze jewel is at the discretion of the District Superintendent but it is likely that the award will be made to an eligible non-member of the Club as an incentive to take up membership.

The number of jewels is determined by the membership in the preceding year (by the number of life members, plus the number of annual subscriptions received from the District Superintendent by the Honorary Membership Secretary).

Only life members and members who have paid their subscriptions for the current year prior to their jewel shoot are eligible to take a jewel. They may only shoot for jewels in the district or division in which they are registered.

Those registered for the 300 metre Division in addition to a district may shoot for both sets of jewels, but may only win one jewel in any year. A member who, after the first of the two jewel shoots, qualifies for a jewel must elect whether to accept that jewel before the competition for the second.

Jewels should be shot for before 31 October each year, with conditions arranged locally. Wherever possible, the competition should be held on a range within the district.

Please note that within the yearbook the following abbreviations may be used: District Superintendent DS, Divisional Superintendent DvS.

English County Rifle Championship for the King George V Challenge Cup

under the auspices of the English Twenty Club

General Rules

1. There shall be an Annual Competition for a Rifle Championship amongst Counties of England represented by teams composed of shots **who are current members of the English Twenty Club** or pupils at Schools affiliated to the Club who are eligible to shoot for England in the National Match.

The particular county for which a person is qualified to shoot is to be decided by one of the following:

- (a) Birth², county of birth of parents or grandparents.
- (b) Residential Parliamentary Vote. Should a person have no such vote he is deemed to have one in the same place as his next of kin.
- (c) After holding a Residential Parliamentary Vote in the County for ten consecutive years a person may opt for that County even though he ceases to be resident in the County.
- (d) A peer may shoot for that County in which he resides.

A person must be registered with the district he elects to shoot for.

Captains, Adjutants and Coaches must be fully qualified to shoot in their Teams.

Two or more counties may apply for fusion and shoot as one county in special circumstances. Applications must be made by 1 November of the preceding year.

2. The King George V Challenge Cup shall be held for the year by the Lord Lieutenant of the Champion County. The Cup is to be returned to the Honorary Secretary on or before 15 June of the year following that in which it was won.

The Match conditions shall be:

- Teams shall be a maximum of twelve a side, consisting of eight firers all to count, two coaches, one Captain and one Adjutant.
- There shall be two targets per team.
- Two sighting shots only per firer, per range, are allowed (convertible). Practice shots are not allowed.
- The course of fire shall be ten shots to count per firer at 300, 500 and 600 yards unless dispensation is granted by the Hon. Secretary of the English Twenty Club.
- The time limit in the first heat is decided by the Captains. In the final it is one hour at each range.
- Team members must use 7.62mm ammunition.
- Rifles: Any rifle included in the NRA Target Rifle classification for the current year may be used.

² Where the county in which is situated the place of birth of a member is subsequently changed, such member may elect to shoot for either the original or the new county but having once shot for the county of his election he shall at all times hereinafter be precluded from shooting for the other county.

- Entrance Fee: £10 per Team, to be paid before shooting to the District Superintendent organising the heat; **any team failing to do this shall be disqualified.**

- In the absence of any local rule, NRA rules shall apply.

Note: In addition to the entrance fee, each team shall equally share the expenses of ammunition, targets, etc.

3. The championship shall be decided by tournament. Only the counties winning their heats shall compete in the final. The county winning the final is the Champion County for the year.
4. The matches in the first heat shall be as follows. They must take place by the end of June in each year. Each group shall be organised by one of the District Superintendents in the group, following in alphabetical order of District name. Details shall be agreed with the other District Superintendents concerned, and failing agreement as determined by the Club Council. The organising District Superintendent shall provide targets and allow ammunition as agreed within the group and also competent butt and range officers. Groups shall be as follows:

North: Cheshire, Lancashire (2015), Northumberland and Durham, Yorkshire

Midlands: Derbyshire (2015), Lincolnshire, Northamptonshire, Leicestershire and Rutland, Nottinghamshire, Warwickshire, Staffordshire and Shropshire, Worcestershire and Herefordshire

West: Cornwall (2015), Devon, Dorset, Gloucestershire, Somerset

East: Bedfordshire (2015), Cambridgeshire, Essex, Hertfordshire, Norfolk, Suffolk

South: Berkshire, Buckinghamshire, Hampshire, London, Oxfordshire (2015), Wiltshire

Home Counties: Kent (2015), Middlesex, Surrey, Sussex

Immediately after the conclusion of the first heat the District Superintendents shall decide the venue for the first heat in the following year.

5. The completed scores shall be certified by the Captains and sent the day after the match to the Honorary Secretary of the English Twenty Club on team registers supplied by the Honorary Secretary.
6. Any County that has been provided with a range and an agreed date but fails to compete shall be held to be beaten.
7. The Final will take place at Bisley Camp on first Thursday of the Imperial Meeting. Any ammunition can be used providing all District Superintendents agree: otherwise ammunition will be issued.
8. Twelve "gold" badges will be given to the winning team, twelve "silver" badges to the second team and twelve "bronze" badges to the third team in the final. The charge to each team entering the final will be for target hire, for markers, for Range Officers and for ammunition (if issued), all at cost.

300 Metre Championship

This is a 60 shot prone event for free rifle under ISSF/UIT rules and shot concurrent with the NRA 300m Championships.

The NRA British 300M Open Championships event was shot on Saturday 17 and Sunday 18 May 2014. It was good to see a strong number of entrants for this competition.

The Championships consist a number of competitions run over the weekend for the 300M discipline, including 60 shot Prone TR/Standard Rifle, 60 shot Free Rifle Prone, 40 shot Free Rifle (Kn/St), and Prone Aggregate.

Match conditions were good with warm temperatures, and light winds (albeit a little stronger on the Sunday) that clearly did not hinder the quality of shooting.

This event is serviced by electronic targets and shot from the 300M shed on the left hand side of Century range. This allows consistent and accurate scoring with all shooters obtaining a copy of their score detail, including group diagrams.

It was unfortunate that there was a technical problem with the server mid-afternoon on the Sunday, forcing the last two competitors on Detail 3 to retire early.

The National Match

Rules

Rules of the “National Challenge Trophy”
Ordered by the Council of the National Match
(Revised in 1997, 2004 and 2007)

1. There shall be an Annual Match known as “The National Match” between English, Scottish, Irish, and Welsh Teams.
 2. There shall be one team of twenty for each of the Nationalities.
 3. (a) The test of nationality shall be either
 - (1) Country of birth, or
 - (2) Descent from parents or grandparents who were qualified by country of birth or
 - (3) Country of residence for a continuous period of not less than five years immediately preceding the date of the Match.
 - (b) A person who has shot for one of the Nationalities specified in Rule 1 in any match under the direction or control of the NRA shall not thereafter be eligible to shoot for another Nationality in the National match.
 - (c) A person who has shot against any Nationality for which he is qualified to shoot under paragraph (a) of this Rule or against Great Britain, in any match under the direction or control of the NRA may not shoot in the National match during the following two-and-a-half-years.
 - (d) A person may not shoot in the National Match in any year in which he is a member of an officially accredited Overseas Team.
 - (e) A person who has shot for a particular country under the rules in force at that time shall remain qualified to shoot for that country in perpetuity.
4. The National Match shall normally take place at the Annual Meeting of the National Rifle Association at Bisley, but every fourth year it may be held at

another venue within the United Kingdom determined by each Nationality in alphabetical order i.e. England, Ireland, Scotland, Wales starting with Scotland in year 2008. If that Nationality cannot hold the Match, the next Nationality in the rota will organise the Match away from Bisley. The Council of the XX Club of the Nationality whose turn it is to organise the Match away from Bisley shall notify in writing the other XX Clubs and the NRA not later than 15th October following the last Match of the date and place in the United Kingdom of the Match for the ensuing year.

5. (a) All matters concerning the National Match, not by these rules placed within the province of the Team Captain shall be in the charge and control of the Council of the National Match.

The Council shall consist of a President and the Captain and two other Representatives of each Nationality.

The President of the Council shall be appointed for one year by each Country in turn in alphabetical order, i.e., England, Ireland, Scotland, Wales.

- (b) The Council shall elect an Honorary Secretary, who need not be a member of the Council, to serve for such a period as the Council shall determine.
- (c) A Meeting of the Council may be convened at any time by the Honorary Secretary at the request of the President or of any of the Captains.

Any such Meetings shall be summoned by at least 14 days' notice in writing to every member of the Council. Such notice shall specify the place, day and hour of the Meeting and the general nature of the business to be transacted.

Length of such notice may be reduced at the discretion of the President if the urgency of the business to be discussed, in his opinion, so requires.

- (d) At all Meetings of the Council every member shall be entitled to one vote upon every question raised. In the case of equality of votes the President shall have a second or casting vote. In the absence of the President the members present shall elect one of their members to act as Chairman. A Chairman so elected shall in the event of equality of votes have a second or casting vote.
 - (e) The quorum at all meetings of the Council shall be seven.
6. The XX Club Council of each Nationality shall in such manner and for such term of office as it may think fit elect or cause to be elected the Captain of the Team of its own Nationality and its other Representatives on the Council of the National Match.
 7. (a) In the event of the Match being held elsewhere than at Bisley the Captain of the team in whose Country the Match is to be held shall be responsible in consultation with the other Captains, for all arrangements in connection with the Match.
 - (b) Each Captain shall be responsible for all the matters in connection with his team including the selection and conduct of its members and he shall have the absolute control of his team in all matters relating to the Match.
 - (c) Each Captain shall nominate an Adjutant who shall deputise for him in the event of circumstances preventing him from fulfilling any of the duties of his office.

- (d) Each Captain shall appoint an Umpire unless the Captains of all competing teams agree to appoint one Umpire only.
8. The following conditions shall apply to the National Match:
- (a) The rules of the NRA current for the year of the Match as to ranges, targets, arms, scoring and position for the first stage of the Queen's Prize shall normally apply.
- (b) At each range the number of shots shall be seven with one convertible sighter.
- (c) Unless the Captains of all competing teams otherwise agree only such ammunition as issued at the Meeting where the Match is held shall be used.
- (d) There may be Check-Register Keepers at each firing point.
- (e) In all matters not provided for by these Rules the current Rules of the NRA shall apply.
9. These Rules may be revoked, added to or altered by a majority of at least two-thirds of the members of the Council present at any Meeting of the Council held at Bisley during the NRA Meeting and summoned by at least 28 days' notice in writing to all members of the Council specifying the intention to propose the revocation, addition or alteration together with full particulars thereof.

Rule 5 (e) shall apply to any such Meeting.

Guidelines for National Team Selection

The Club Council at its meetings on 1 June 1952 and 24 May 1953 resolved that the following policy should be followed when selecting the National team.

The team and reserves should normally be selected from those competing in the English Twenty Club Championship.

The winner of the Queen's Prize in the preceding year, if qualified under 3 (a), should be included in the team.

Half the team should consist of those who have not shot more than once before; at least five should not have shot in the National match at all before.

The five reserves should never before have shot or been a reserve in this match.

District Superintendents are requested to notify the Captain of promising shooters in their districts.
